ELIGIBILITY

Open to Harvard PhD students in the social sciences who will be entering their G-2 or G-3 year in September 2021.

The Multidisciplinary Program in Inequality & Social Policy is designed for Harvard PhD students in economics, education, government, health policy, political economy and government, psychology, public policy, sociology, and social policy. The curriculum predominantly draws on the fields of economics, political science, sociology, and social policy. Students from other Harvard doctoral programs with a related social science background are welcome to apply.

FELLOWSHIP SELECTION

Be sure to obtain the companion Inequality & Social Policy brochure from our website, which provides important information about the Stone PhD Scholar fellowships and terms of participation.

A distinctive emphasis of the Inequality & Social Policy program is to spur new research on income and wealth concentration at the top of the distribution. Half of the Stone PhD Scholar fellowships are specifically designated for students who will work on research questions in this area. The remaining Stone PhD Scholar fellowships are open to students working on issues of inequality, broadly defined.
